### PURPOSE:

The Pre-Conference Student Leadership Institute is a daylong session, prior to the Intersegmental Convocation, designed to provide student leaders with an opportunity to meet with fellow students from public and private higher education institutions across the state to work on the deep-rooted educational issues affecting the Chicano/Latino community. The Institute will:

- Provide a forum for student leaders to express their views regarding issues they face within higher education,
- Provide presentations, discussions and interactions with various higher education experts and leaders and;
- Assist student leaders to develop critical questions and discuss possible solutions to the problems facing Chicanos and Latinos in California.

Because they are the major stakeholders within the higher education systems, student leaders have a responsibility to provide input regarding future policy direction. As potential future educational, professional and civic leaders, the convocation allows each student leader to return to their respective campus with a cadre of supporters among faculty, staff, and other students to create campus awareness in the pursuit of increased access and success for Chicanos and Latinos in higher education.

### STRUCTURE:

The Student leadership Institute is a one-day institute with debriefing sessions throughout the convocation to discuss and develop recommendations for each policy theme. During the institute, the students will be presented with in-depth information regarding the convocation's policy themes, and begin discussions about possible resolutions and action plans.

The student leaders will self-select a theme group to participant in throughout the convocation. The students will attend the convocation sessions related to their chosen theme policy and attend daily debriefing sessions. Through the debriefing sessions, the student leaders will develop recommendations to present during the closing plenary of the convocation.

Each policy theme group will be assigned a Graduate Fellow who will assist the facilitator and lead the debriefing session discussions. The Graduate Fellows will be selected through an application process and open to graduating seniors and graduate students.
